Students may be required to complete a supplemental residency questionnaire to clarify residency or apply for residency reclassification. Residency changes are not automatic. **Residency will not be changed after the 5th week of the semester.** To be considered for residency, you must:

- 1) Be physically present in the state for at least **one year and one day** prior to the start of the semester.
- 2) Show documentation of intent to establish residency.
- 3) Not be precluded from establishing residency by provisions of the Immigration and Nationality Act.

The burden of proof is on the student to clearly demonstrate both physical presence and intent to establish residency. All documents presented must be valid, legible, dated at least one year prior to the residence determination date and be properly identified with the student's name and address.

COLLEGE OF THE REDWOODS RESIDENCY - SPECIAL CONSIDERATION REQUIREMENTS

California regulations allow students meeting certain criteria to pay California resident fees even if they have not met the requirements of physical presence and intent to be a resident. To be considered under these special provisions, please see the applicable section below.

Self supporting minor

If you are under 19 years of age and have supported yourself financially for at least one year and a day, please provide both of the following:

1. W-2 forms or other documentation showing your earnings for the past year.
2. A written statement showing your expenses during the past year.

Note: To claim this status, you must have been physically present in California for the past year.

Member of the U.S. Military on active duty in California

If you are a member of the United States Military stationed in California on active duty, please provide one of the following:

1. Evidence of the date of assignment to California.
2. Statement from your commanding officer or personnel officer that you are assigned to active duty in California.

Discharged member of the U.S. Military remaining in California

If you were a member of the United States Military who was stationed in California for more than one year immediately prior to being discharged and you have remained in California for less than a year and one day, please provide a copy of your Military Discharge Form.

Dependent (child or spouse) of a member of the military stationed in California

If you are the dependent of a member of the armed forces of the United States who is stationed in California, please provide both of the following:

1. A statement from the military member's commanding officer or personnel officer stating that they are assigned to active duty in California
2. Evidence that you are a dependent of the military person's for federal tax purposes.

Public school employee with a valid credential or emergency permit

If you are employed by a school district in a full-time position and hold a valid credential or valid emergency permit and are enrolled in courses to meet credential requirements, please provide both of the following:

1. Copy of your credential or emergency permit
2. Statement from your employer that you are employed in a full-time position requiring certification qualifications

Employee (or the spouse or child of an employee) of a California state agency assigned to work outside of California

If you, your parent or spouse is employed full-time by a California state agency and is assigned to work outside of California, please provide both of the following:

1. Proof of employment

Proof of assignment outside of California

Employee (or the spouse or child of an employee) of a California Community College, California State University or Colleges, the University of California, or the California Maritime Academy

If you, your parent or spouse is employed full-time by one of the California institutions listed above, please provide the following:

1. Proof of employment
2. Proof that the student has not lived in California for more than one year since arriving or since attaining age 18, whichever came later.

In the process of being classified as a peace officer and are enrolled in police academy training courses at CR

If you are currently enrolled in police academy training courses and a public agency intends to classify you as a police officer upon successful completion of the courses, please provide evidence that the public agency intends to classify you as a peace officer.

Agricultural laborer for hire (or child of an agricultural laborer).

If you or your parent is seasonally employed in connection with production of agricultural crops including seeding, thinning and harvesting, please provide the following:

1. Evidence that you or your parent earned a livelihood by performing agricultural labor in California for at least two months during each of the preceding two years.
2. Dependents only: Evidence that your parent lives within the district and proof that your parent claims you as a dependent on his or her income tax forms.

Graduate of a school in California operated by the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs

If you are a graduate of a school operated by the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs that is located in California, please provide a copy of your diploma.

Surviving dependent of any individual killed in the September 11th terrorist attacks

If you are a surviving dependent of an individual killed in the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks, please provide a copy of your written notice of eligibility for a tuition and fee waiver by the California Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board.

AB540 Exempt

If you attended a California high school for at least three years and graduated or received a certificate of completion, please request and complete the AB540 Tuition Exemption form.
