The session was titled "Changing the Odds Through Culturally Responsive Curriculum," and was hosted by Allan Hancock College. The workshop focused on the importance of adapting our teaching methods and materials to reflect the cultural backgrounds of all students. Here are the main points:

Key Components of the Assessment Tool

- **Theoretical Framework:** The tool is grounded in the principles of culturally responsive and sustaining education, emphasizing the importance of including diverse cultural perspectives and experiences in the curriculum to promote deeper connections and understanding among students.
- **Assessment Categories:** It features specific categories for assessment, including:
 - **Representation:** Evaluating the diversity of individuals, authors, portrayals, and the accuracy of these portrayals in course materials.
 - **Social Justice:** Focusing on themes such as power, privilege, systemic oppression, and action orientation to ensure the curriculum fosters a comprehensive understanding of and engagement with these critical issues.
- **Assessment Process:** The tool guides educators through a structured process to review various elements of the curriculum, such as syllabi, textbooks, and other materials, to gauge how well they incorporate and reflect principles of cultural responsiveness and sustainability.
- **Action Steps:** Based on the assessment results, educators are prompted to take specific actions to enhance the cultural responsiveness of their curriculum. This may involve revising content to include more diverse perspectives, addressing identified gaps, or enhancing the curriculum's overall approach to cultural inclusivity.
- **Resources and Support:** The tool includes references to additional resources such as scholarly articles, books, and websites that can provide further guidance and support for educators looking to implement culturally responsive and sustaining practices in their teaching.

I have sent a PDF copy of the assessment tool to Julie to share with everyone. I believe this tool will be very useful in guiding our efforts to evaluate our programs through a culturally responsive lens.
