Hours may vary during academic breaks. Closed during Holidays.

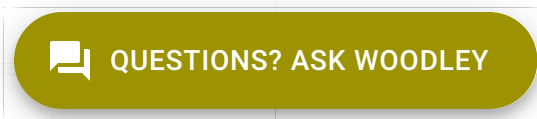

Attend a New Student Advising/Registration Workshop

Articulation

Articulation is the process of evaluating courses to determine whether coursework completed at one institution (e.g., a community college) will meet the requirements at another institution (e.g. a university) for the purposes of admission, transferable units, general education or major preparation. It is this process that ensures that the classes you take at College of the Redwoods will be credited toward your bachelor's degree requirements when you enter a university.

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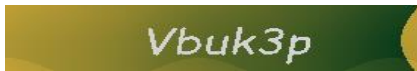
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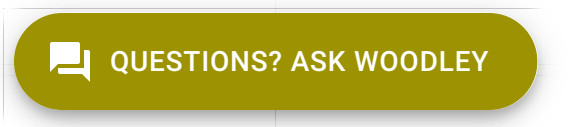
