In the summer of 2020, two outcomes were assessed through our work study course. One was the clarification of student career goals and the other was showing demonstration of a college or life skill from students who attended the summer program.

With regard to the careers class, this year the class size was 11. We provided those students with a survey and 45% participated. Of those that participated 85% said that they agreed with the statement that "This class helped me to clarify and/or narrow down my career goals". We saw an increase from last years 70%. This class was offered online with fresh content that was more guided and explicitly went over career goals and how to get there. Students participation was documented through Google classroom and showed 81% of students passed the course and showed the ability to research and participate in exercises to increase their career knowledge.

With regard to demonstrating a college or life skill, during the summer program students were enrolled in a virtual Career and College focused work study course that helped them build upon their college knowledge and research skills in order to prepare them for post secondary education. Students researched and discussed these subjects weekly: 1. WHO, WHAT AND WHERE??? ESTABLISHING CAREER WITH PERSONAL STRENGTHS, 2.CAREER OUTLOOK, 3. COLLEGE, TECH SCHOOL, LINCENSURES AND TRAINING, 4. CREATING RESUME AND COVER LETTER, 5. INTERVIEW WEEK, 6. FINAL PROJECT (all research from weeks 1–5 compiled into a research project). Of the fifty-four (52) students who participated in our summer program, thirty-eight (38) students enrolled in work study. We were able to gather thirty-three (33) satisfactory examples of work

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The only area of concern in our assessment this year came from the career class survey results. In regards to this area, we will need to make sure that we get a truly accurate measure of the impact of the class by ensuring that all participants complete the survey.

We will also continue to work towards helping students to complete a rigorous curriculum by offering online options, online tutoring, and added advising on how to meet state or federal requirements. Since this is a UB federal objective, we need to continue to work on improving this outcome as well as improving our GPA objective.

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
