Spring Week Events

The ASCR funded spring week events were a major success. In total more than 400 students participated according to sign in sheets.

The field day was the largest of the events, with public safety and campus PD grilling hot dogs for students, field day games across the field, a dunk tank, and many food options ranging from cotton candy to shaved ice.

LRC Laptop

The ASCR was informed that more than 20 of the laptops that the LRC had to check out to students had been damaged and could no longer be used.

VP of Records Gabriel Brooks brought this to the attention of the senate and the ASCR has moved to fund more than \$25,000 for the purchase of 20 laptops for the LRC to be able to check out to students in need.

ASCR Constitution and Bylaws

Having seen a need for greater support for campus clubs and seeing the difficulty and workload of the Executive Organizational Senator position with having duties related to all clubs and all ASCR events, the ASCR has amended its constitution and bylaws to split the position into two:

Vice President of Events, who will lead the events committee and aid in the creation and executive of ASCR events.

InterCLub Council Chair: who will chair monthly meetings of the interclub council and be a point of contact for club members and advisors.

Kt Campus Beautification

The ASCR has funded more than \$18,000 for campus beautification projects at the Klamath Trinity Campus. This included tree removal, drain repair, tree trimming, and various landscaping.

Hupa-1A and 1B Informational Session

The ASCR had funded \$600 for a Hupa Language informational session/finals party on May 2nd with discussion led by Danny Ammon and food for all attendees. The event was a large success with many students showing appreciation.
