| Enrollment Information |

■ Complete an Application Form

Application forms are available at the Enrollment Services window, in the Counseling Office, or online at www.redwoods.edu. A student ID number will be issued after your application has been processed.

■ Take English and Math Assessments

You need to take the English and Math assessments if you plan to (a) pursue a degree or certificate that has English or math in the curriculum, (b) pursue a transfer program, or (c) take a course that has an English or math prerequisite.

Submit an application online at www.redwoods.edu or in person at the Enrollment Services window and obtain your student ID number. Sign up—in advance—to take assessments at the Enrollment Services window, or contact Lia Grijalva-Davis at 962.2664.

Note: Anyone taking an assessment **MUST** present a current photo ID at the time of testing or will not be permitted to take the exam. Students must also have a CR ID number before taking assessments.

■ Request College Transcripts

If you are new to CR, but have attended other colleges, unofficial transcripts are needed to help plan your schedule and to determine whether you have success-

fully completed prerequisites for specific courses. Official transcripts from other colleges are required to determine eligibility for an Associate degree and/or for financial aid purposes.

■ Make a Counseling Appointment

Make a counseling appointment with David Gonsalves to obtain assessment results and to plan your schedule of classes. To schedule an appointment, please call 962.2605 or 962.2607.

■ Apply for Financial Aid

If you need financial assistance, applications are available in the Financial Aid Office. These applications and forms must be completed and returned as soon as possible in order to determine eligibility.

■ Register for Classes

Once you have a student ID number and have completed pre-registration activities, you will be able to register for classes by completing a Multi-Purpose Registration Form. Be sure to include the six-digit section number for each course you wish to take. You can register online (Web Advisor), or in person at the Enrollment Services window.

■ Web Advisor Online Services

Any person can search for open classes offered at College of the Redwoods. Be sure to specify the semester and the campus location. Once you have been assigned a student ID number, you can log into WebAdvisor where you will be able to:

- Register for classes
- Drop classes
- Review and print grades and GPA information from prior semesters
- Review your student account and account balance
- Obtain student specific Financial Aid information
- Review your own address and phone information

- ▶ Click on Web Advisor
- ▶ Your Login ID number is the first initial of your first name, followed by your last name, and the last 3 digits of your student ID number. Example: jdoe310
- ▶ Your password for the first time is your birthdate in mmddyy format. For example, if you were born on August 13, 1984 then enter 081384
- ▶ After you first log in, the system will want you to change your password. The new password must be 6–9 characters in length and it must contain both letters and numbers. Be sure to read the instructions shown at the password prompt. Remember to record this password in a safe place. Once in the system, all the previously mentioned features are available on WebAdvisor.

| Fees, Refunds and Financial Aid |

■ Fees

Payment of fees is due at the time of registration. The college accepts cash, personal checks, money orders, and credit cards: Visa, M/C, Discover. Payment may be made in person or online through WebAdvisor. A student's registration may be cancelled if payment is not received. Non-residents pay CA fee plus Non-resident tuition.

■ Required Fees:

CA Resident fee:	\$26/unit
Non-resident tuition:	\$226/unit
Oregon Exchange tuition fee:	\$61/unit
Health fee:	\$4/semester

There is no charge for parking on the Mendocino Coast Campus.

■ Financial Aid

Students may be eligible for financial aid while attending College of the Redwoods. Funds are provided from federal, state and local programs. Students are encouraged to complete a Board of Governors Grant (BOG) fee waiver and/or a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

The Board of Governors (BOG) fee waiver program waives enrollment fees and health fees for qualifying students. The BOG fee waiver does not apply to course material fees or textbooks. To be eligible for a BOG fee waiver a student must be classified as a California resident

for the determination of enrollment fees and must meet income criteria. Application forms for BOG fee waivers are available at all CR campuses and instructional sites and online at <http://www.redwoods.edu/Financial-Aid/>.

Scholarships and other financial aid programs may also be available. Contact Marcia Williams, the Financial Aid Specialist, at 962.2606 for an appointment. The Financial Aid office is located in room 107.

■ Refunds

Refunds will be mailed from the Business Office in Eureka to eligible students. To be eligible for a refund of fees, a student must drop a class by the refund date listed on the cover of the schedule.

■ Residency Status

Residency status is determined in the admissions process. Appeals by a non-resident student for reclassification as a California resident, including all required documentation, must be filed within the first four weeks of a fall or spring semester, or within the first week of a winter or summer term.

■ Veterans' Benefits

Veterans' benefits are available including benefits for National Guard Reserve, Vocational Rehabilitation, V.E.A.P., and the Montgomery Bill. Contact the Financial Aid Office for more information 962.2606.






ONLINE CLASSES

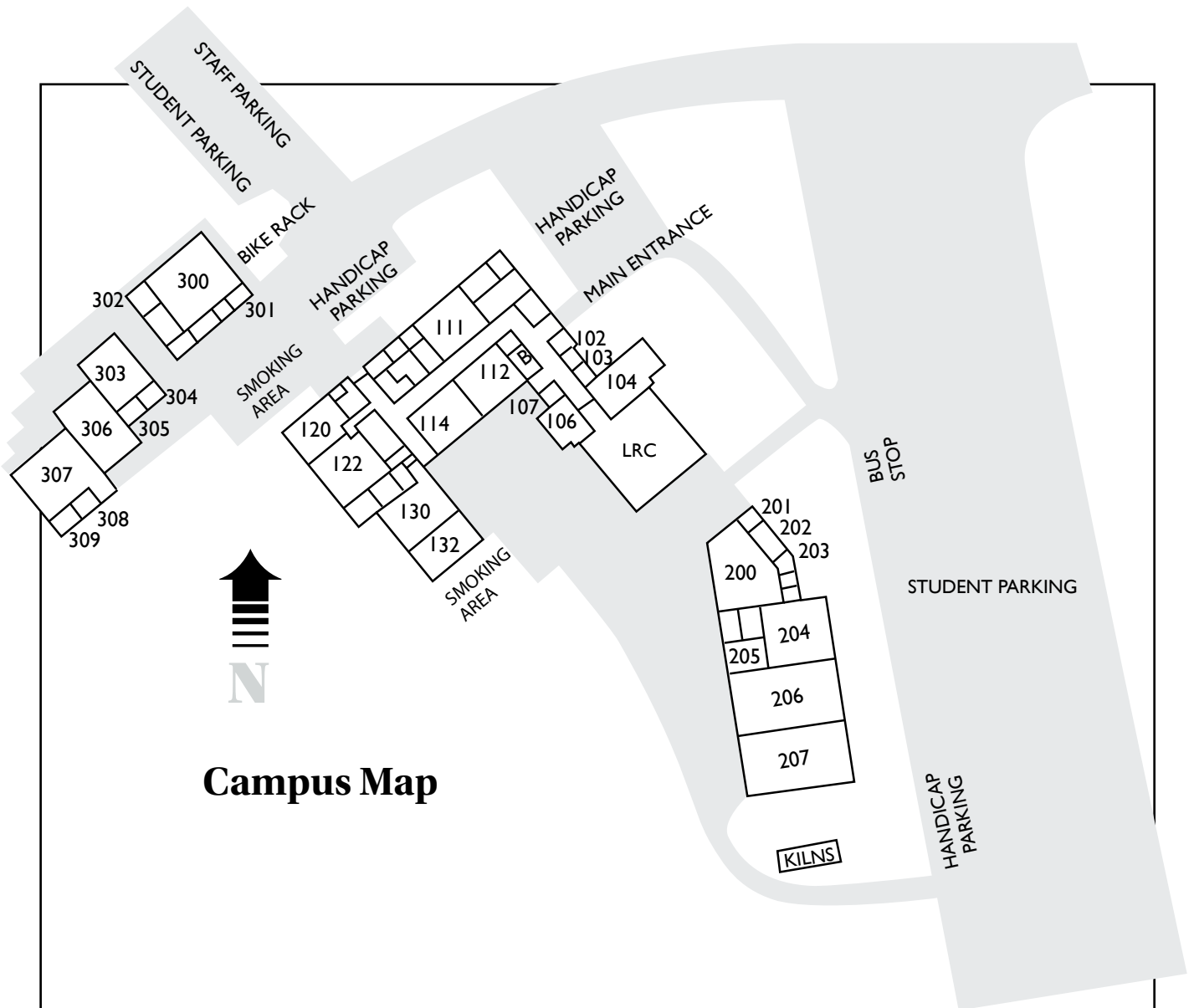

They require students to have consistent access to the Internet, preferably by cable or DSL, as well as basic skills in learning and studying in an online environment. Classes use the MyCR Collaborative Learning Environment (CLE) built on the Sakai platform. It is recommended that students enroll in the Student Orientation for Online Learning prior to taking any online classes for the first time.

Note: Textbooks for online classes are not available at the Mendocino Campus bookstore. To determine which textbook is required for your online class, go to the web site and click the online classes link. Once you know the title, author, edition, and ISBN number, you are free to contact any outside vendor to purchase your book. If you want to purchase your textbooks from the CR Bookstore in Eureka, you must know the name of the class, section number, and instructor's name.
